Eastern PA

EPARNA region continues to operate with 3 areas Bucks, Pure and Simple, and Twin Rivers areas. All areas within the region are meeting regularly as they did before the pandemic disruption. All of the areas besides Bucks County continue to meet on the zoom platform. Bucks' county has returned to in-person area sessions as of June 2021.

EPARNA continues to support areas affected by the pandemic by providing guidance and funding for Covid 19 cleaning supplies as requested by the areas. The areas also continue to provide H&I and PR services to their perspective areas and groups, despite the pandemic. These H&I meetings are held in-person and via zoom where requested.

EPARNA regional meeting was held in June via zoom and will continue to do so, although there is a motion to be discussed in August session, as to whether we should return to inperson sessions. This motion will be discussed when the region meets again on August 1st. During the June EPARNA session a motion was brought before the region that explores the options of continuing to operate as an unseated region within the WSC service structure or disbanding EPARNA. The intent of the motion is as follows:

There are two intents for this motion.

- 1. The first intent is to obtain a vote in Narcotics Anonymous.
- 2. The second intent is to foster unity with Greater Philadelphia Region, Narcotics Anonymous as a whole, and maintain the unity with the three remaining areas in EPARNA.

EPARNA region continues to refine this motion for consumption by its areas and groups. A new refined motion will be presented at the August 1st meeting of EPARNA. This motion has not been formally presented to the areas and groups within EPARNA at this time.

The Freestate Region consists of 10 areas covering Maryland, Delaware and Virginia. Many meetings and service bodies are beginning to meet in person or hybrid. Some of our areas are having more success than other re-opening and filling positions. The Freestate Regional Committee could not come to a consensus on whether to meet hybrid or stay on line, so we will continue to meet on line. Our meeting place is open with restrictions. Freestate has been fortunate to have received regular donations from various areas and have been able to donate to the world on a fairly regular basis.

The FSR put forward a motion to be placed in the CAR.

Motion:

To direct NA World Services to remove the Hospitals and Institutions Handbook from the inventory

Intent:

To remove an outdated service manual from WSO inventory

Rationale:

The H&I handbook has not been updated since the 1980's and with our current literature update process, will never be prioritized high enough. We believe a better approach would be to update the Public Relations Handbook Chapter 6 (Criminal Justice) resource section and H&I Basics with more information relevant to current practices and methods for carrying our





Discussion

- Increase voting participants Clarence
 - -I believe the ADs should have a voice at the zone, regardless of whether the RD is present or not. I do not see how having the ADs have a vote will affect us. If just allows us more information
 - -cannot have both votes in other forums (WSC)
 - -it will not affect the regions, just the zone. Nothing has ever come up that affects one region over another.
 - -the uncomfortablilty comes when there is a difference between the team, and they may see things differently. If we each have a different vote, how would that affect the team.
 - -We need more than just 5 votes making decisions. X2
 - -One vote per region X2
 - -When we have to make decisions that are not going back to the region, we need to be able to make decisions on the floor. This allows for a larger vote.
 - -consensus means we hear from all voices, and we get to hear all sides
 - -Listening to a thought-out proposal, the vote is not really an issue, fully participating in the decision-making process
 - -Sometimes we have different ideas
 - STRAW POLL- RDs and RDAs to vote, 3 in support
 - **DECISION-Failed**

o Proposals -

Communications Task Team has 3 proposals

- 1. Create a standing Technology Team and approve the proposed guidelines
- 2. Create a social Media Account on FB, Instagram, and Twitter. (ITT would not create the messaging)
- 3. Create/ enact a self-messaging service and put a link to it on the website Reactions:
- -we need to take time to review the guidelines. It is suggested we table this discussion until we have time to look it over.
- -A friendly amendment; Create a standing Technology Lead. No second to this amendment.
- -We are creating a leader without having a team first. Understand what that body will be doing. Form follows function.
- -the task team should have some of the responsibilities that fall under the leader's duties. The leader would have oversight for these responsibilities. There would then be shared effort.

Based on the survey results, our efforts focused on the following Ideas for improved zonal communications:

- 1. It is **Technically feasible to improve our communications regarding providing meeting information on the AZF website.** The meetings option that existed on the website was replaced by adding BMLT. People are no longer being redirected to the NA.org site. Instead, the meeting information from within our zone is now available on our zonal website.
- 2. It is Technically feasible to add a Fellowship Project Services Request form inviting opportunities for mentorship/assistance to the website. These requests could go to a Fellowship Development team.
- 3. It is Technically feasible to improve our communications via Social Media.

After some research and brainstorming our recommendation is

- a) Get social media accounts (FB, Instagram, Twitter)
- b) Monitor these accounts for a period of time
- c) If warranted enact an open-source social media platform

Financial Impact – Free-\$99/month (or paid annually)

Content to be distributed on these accounts would be developed by another Communications (PR) Team or Fellowship Development Team

- 4. It is **Technically feasible to enact a self-subscribe service that distributes MMS, SMS messages.** All MMS messages could link to content on the AZF website. (ex: Post the minutes and then mass text the notification... post events on the website and then mass text to notify people)
- 5. **We Worked on Guidelines for the Web Servant or a Web Team** and our proposal is for a Technology Team Leader (TTL) who oversees a standing Technology Team Workgroup.

Our proposed guidelines follow:

Proposed AZF Technology Team Leader (TTL) Guidelines

Qualifications

- 1. Minimum 8 years continuous clean time
- 2. Previous service experience
- 3. Computer tech expertise
- 4. Access to internet, email, skilled with HTML, WordPress and other website tools
- 5. Ability to delegate / organize
- 6. Ability to collaborate with others

Duties and Responsibilities

- 1. Provides an activity report at each AZF meeting
- Creates email accounts and forwarders for Facilitator, Secretary, Treasurer, and Web Servant (TTL)
- 3. Maintains maintenance guides and tutorials
- Maintains website content based on zonal input. No external links except to member RSC committed, other zones, and NAWS
- 5. Maintains AZF Guidelines / calendar of events as received from individuals within zone
- 6. Has access to the AZF electronic communication account
- Maintains an online document of all passwords and account information and shares access with Facilitator

MISC

- 1. Elected, non-voting member of the AZF
- 2. One Technology Team (TT) trusted servant will have edit permissions to update website content at a time. (Facilitator has backup editing permission should the need arise)
- 3. Attendance at AZF meetings optional unless funded
- 4. Position is a two-year term coinciding with the cycle, with a maximum of two consecutive terms
- Oversees a standing Technology Team Workgroup which is composed of 5 volunteers; ideally; one from each of our participating regions. The workgroup meetings will be open to all NA Members
- 6. Volunteers of the TT will work in cooperation with the TTL and the AZF. Meetings can be called on an as needed basis.

Website

- Purpose: information exchange between other Regions, Zones, and NA World Services.
- Should be owned, funded, and hosted by zone.
- Storage place for all archived Information.

In Conclusion we are prepared today to make 3 proposals –

- 1. Create a Standing Technology Team (TT) (and approve the proposed guidelines)
- 2. Create A social Media Account on FB, Instagram, and Twitter (The TT would not create the messaging)
- 3. Create/Enact A Self-subscribe messaging service and put a link to it on the website.


Web Site Report AZF

All information with regards to the website domain registration and hosting has been moved to the AZF Google Docs account with Rob and Kim having been given access.





Web Site Report AZF




- Since we last met, I submitted an invoice from Webmastery. Org to C&P and received payment for January-June (6 months) domain registration (\$7.50) charges.
